 3. Commissioner Ekta Srinivasa - mental health is a topic in the federal level which makes it common to many groups- include testimonies from LS of community members in the HHS meeting
 4. Commissioner Marilyn Park- Bhutanese suicide rate = incredibly powerful and significant data point - wonders if we can include and ask about how accessible 988 (mental health crisis #) is to refugees (Commissioner Amy Goh echoes Commissioner Park's points in Zoom chat)
 5. Commissioner Moana Bentin - what is the



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Commission's role, what do we need?

- a. Commissioner Ekta Srinivasa - suggest interventions to HHS webinar event
- b. Ask what providers did in their home country's to treat and aid in mental health - get understanding of origin of the health issues - brainstorm
- c. Commissioner Saatvik Ahluwalia - past experience in Texas - hosted an event in collaboration with HHS Communications Director - outcome of this was translated mental health resources - encouraged and held **state gov accountable** for health info for AAPI - hope to invite leaders who create info and hope to make it culturally competent for AAPI community members - how HHS can market to make resources accessible in AAPI communities
- d. Dedicated HHS, SAMSA meeting on July 30th - what can AAPIC provide these orgs before the **Meeting 7/30 date** - **brainstorming session is 12:30 PM 07/09**
 - i. What to share?
- e. Commissioner Park - what info are we using to bring forward the issues in mental health in AAPI? If just listening sessions, just two communities of focus
 - i. Are we advocating for trauma focused mental health needs?

During the meeting, Shubhecchha Dhaurali presented the results of the Community Health Equity survey conducted by the Department of Health for



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Massachusetts. Subgroup categories were discussed, and attendees expressed interest in including all subgroups in the analysis. Strategies to improve mental health support for AAPI communities were discussed, including visualizing data, setting up listening sessions, and advocating for culturally competent resources. Attendees emphasized the importance of working with state legislators and community organizations to push for policy changes, and highlighted the need for culturally responsive, trauma-focused mental health services.

- Yasmin Padamsee Forbes suggests including information from various community sessions, such as Burmese sessions, to identify common themes and solutions.

Mental health resources for refugees and migrants.

- Refugees' mental health challenges, including suicide rate twice US population, discussed at HHS meeting.
- Marilyn Park and Moana Bentin discuss crisis intervention and resource access for migrant communities.



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- Ekta Srinivasa shares an idea for providers from migrants' countries of origin to address cultural competency issues in mental health care.

Advocating for API mental health issues with government officials.

- Saatvik Ahluwalia shared an example of advocating for culturally competent mental health resources in Texas.
- Yasmin Padamsee Forbes agreed and emphasized the importance of holding legislators and executive departments accountable.
- Yasmin Forbes and team brainstorm with HHS and SAMHSA on July 20 to improve outreach to AAPI community.

Mental health issues in AAPI communities, planning for public hearings.

- Marilyn Park discusses mental health issues affecting AAPI communities, including suicide risk and intergenerational conflict.
- Marilyn Park and Yasmin Padamsee Forbes discuss using data from listening sessions to inform a hearing on mental health impacting AAPI populations.
- Saatvik Ahluwalia raises the idea of a hearing distinct from HHS engagement, leveraging expertise and research on mental health impacts in AAPI communities.
- Commission aims to connect mental health data gaps in ABI communities through public hearings.

Mental health, workplace violence, and policy gaps.

- Commissioner Park agrees with Ekta on need for mental health support in communities.
- Amy Goh discusses workplace violence impacting Asian Americans and healthcare professionals.
- Ekta Srinivasa and Shubhecchha Dhaurali discuss the commission's hearings and key issue area determination process.
- Commission members agree on mental health, language, access, and housing as potential key issue areas.
- Marilyn asks about data on refugees utilizing HHS's suicide hotline.
